NEP STAGES

FOUNDATIONAL STAGE (5 Years)

ALPHADALE ASSISI NURSERY & KINDERGARTEN has been established as part of the **ASSISI VIDYANIKETAN PUBLIC SCHOOL** Institutions.

PRE-KG

It is envisioned as a prelude to formal education and is adapted to fulfill the objectives of the Early Childhood stage of Education according to the new National Education Policy. Kids enter Pre-KG (Nursery) at 3 years and move on to Kindergarten at 4 years of age.

KINDERGARTEN

Alphadale is a spacious, uniquely curated campus with a fascinating ambience and opportunities for fun-filled and creative learning available not only in the classrooms but in every nook and corner of the campus. We aim at inculcating in children the skills required for formal education through joyful learning, while at the same time ensuring all aspects of holistic development. The curriculum is scientifically designed and monitored by trained personnel for effective implementation.

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LOWER PRIMARY SECTION – CLASSES I & II

Class I is housed within the Kiddies Quad building, carefully selected to ensure the safety and well-being of our young learners. Meanwhile Class 2 occupies the ground floor of Annexe A building. Our paramount objective is to provide a superior education intertwined with character enrichment, emphasizing the cultivation of self – discipline and essential life skills. Core subjects encompass English, Mathematics, Malayalam, Hindi, Computer Science, and General knowledge. Additionally, students partake in enriching activities, including singing, dancing, and musical pursuits.

PREPARATORY STAGE (3 Years)

PRIMARY SECTION – CLASSES III-V

The Primary Classes are housed in separate blocks. Here the focus is on instilling in students a natural interest and love for learning and developing socially worthy behaviour and values. English, Hindi, Malayalam, Mathematics, Environmental Studies and Computer Science are taught. The students are also given training in English Communication, Music, Dance, Drawing, Craft etc.



MIDDLE STAGE– CLASSES VI-VIII (3 Years)

The students of Classes VI-VIII are prepared for Competency Based Assessment and for imbibing 21st century skills. Other than academics, the students also get good exposure to co-curricular activities. The following subjects are taught: English, Second and Third Languages (Hindi/Malayalam), Mathematics, Science (Physics, Chemistry & Biology) and Social Science (History, Civics, Geography, Economics). Physical & Health Education, Work Experience, Art Education, Music, Value Education, Life skills & Career Guidance Programmes also form part of the curriculum. The students actively involve in club activities and prevocational trainings.

SECONDARY STAGE CLASSES IX-XII (4 Years)

SECONDARY SECTION

The students of Classes IX and X are prepared for Competency Based Assessment and for imbibing 21st century skills. Class X students appear for the CBSE X Board Exam(AISSE).

Other than academics, the students also get good exposure to co-curricular activities. The following subjects are taught: English, Second and Third Languages (Hindi/Malayalam),

Mathematics, Science (Physics, Chemistry & Biology) and Social Science (History, Civics, Geography, Economics). Physical & Health Education, Work Experience, Art Education,

Music, Value Education, Life skills & Career Guidance Programmes also form part of the curriculum.

SENIOR SECONDARY SECTION

This section was started in 1999 and students are prepared for the CBSE XII Board Exam (AISSCE). There are Science, Commerce & Humanities streams and following subjects are taught :

Science1 : Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Computer Science

Science2 : Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Mathematics /Informatics Practice / Home Science / Physical Education.

Commerce : Accountancy, Business Studies, Economics, Mathematics / Psychology/Informatics Practices /Home Science/Physical Education

Humanities : History, Political Science, Informatics Practices /Psychology, Economics /Home Science/Physical Education

Artificial Intelligence is offered as the Skill subject



SCHOLASTIC EVALUATION SYSTEM

Pre KG – Continuous and comprehensive evaluation takes place in a non-threatening manner through observation of the child's performance during class activities. Areas assessed are: Physical Development and Social, Emotional, Cognitive, Linguistic & Logical Skills.

Kindergarten – Assessment takes place in both Formative and Summative modes. Summative Assessment takes place twice a year. The parameters of Assessment include: Literacy Skills, Numeracy Skills, Fine & Gross Motor Skills, Art Integrated Learning & Personal, Socio-Emotional Well-being.

Classes I & II - These classes will have Periodic Assessments. There will be a series of Six Assessments paced out during the academic year. These students will not be permitted to carry books in their bag. All books will be kept in the School itself: From time to time Parents will be informed about Portions covered and before each Assessment they will be given Worksheets to help with Revision. No Home work is given for students of these classes. One of the Assessments in each term will be an Interdisciplinary activity.

Classes III- V – The classes will have 2 Terms. In each Term they will have two Periodic Tests and One Terminal Exam. The entire syllabus taught in a Term will be assessed during the Terminal Exams- However portions will not be carried over for assessment from one Term to the other. Portions for Periodic Test / Exams will be informed and Answer Papers will be sent home to the parents for their perusal. These should be counter-signed and returned the following day itself. One of the Assessments in each term will be an Interdisciplinary activity.

Classes VI to VIII will have 2 terms and in each Term there will be two Periodic Tests and One Terminal Exam. Portions for Periodic Test / Exams will be informed and Answer Papers will be sent home to the parents for their perusal. These should be counter-signed and returned the following day itself.

The weightage given to marks for Periodic Test / Terminal Exam will be as follows :

For Classes VI - VIII Annual Exam Syllabus will be as follows :

- Class VI : 10% of First Term Portions + Full Portions of Second Term
Class VII : 20% of First Term Portions + Full Portions of Second Term
Class VIII : 30% of First Term Portions + Full Portions of Second Term

Classes IX & X - The classes will continue to have a system of Periodic Assessments followed by an Annual Exam. In Class IX, a student who fails to secure 33% of marks in the Continuous Promotion Record for each of the subjects, is not eligible for Promotion to Class X.

Classes XI & XII – These classes will continue to have a system of Unit Tests and Terminal Examinations. In Class XI, a student who fails to secure 33% of marks in the Continuous Promotion Record for each of the subjects, is not eligible for Promotion to Class XII.

ASSISI COMPETENCY ASSESSMENT AND SAFAL

The Assisi Competency Assessment is part of all the examinations and gives due weightage to competency-based questions as envisaged in National Education Policy. This prepares students for the Structured Assessment for Analyzing Learning (SAFAL) conducted by CBSE for Classes III, V and VIII. Teachers also assess whether the students have attained the learning outcome meant for their level and re-strategize accordingly.

SCIENCE OLYMPIAD FOUNDATION

The school conducts various SOF International Olympiads in General Knowledge, English, Science, Mathematics, Cyber, Social Studies and Commerce to help students assess themselves as per national and international standards.

ASSISI MERIT SCHOLARSHIP EXAMINATION

The prestigious Assisi Merit Scholarship Examination is conducted for all the students of KG to Class XII. An approximate total amount of Rs. 1, 75,000/- is given as the prize money to the A & B grade holders.

SCHOLARSHIP FOR LATIN CATHOLIC STUDENTS

Our school runs under the aegis of Archdiocese of Verapoly. Our institution recognizes the meritorious students belonging to the Latin Catholic community by offering the Latin Catholic Scholarship Award for students.



INTER – SCHOOL PROGRAMMES

Students regularly take part in a number of Inter-School Competitions and Festivals

KAIROS

The Inter School Cultural Fiesta, Kairos hosted by our School is a tribute to the Founder Director, Rev Dr. Francis Kannikal, S.J. A good number of schools from in and around Kochi city participate in this cultural extravaganza. The students from Classes I-XII get opportunities to showcase their talents in drawing, acting, music, dance and literary skills. The competition is hosted by Class XI students and it helps them to hone their skills in coordinating, organizing and conducting mega events.

EXCURSIONS

Every year the different classes are taken for Excursions to various spots in and around Kerala such as Fort Kochi, Wonderla Amusement Park, Marine World Chavakkad, Thrissur Zoo, Vagamon, Kulamavu, Munnar, Silver Storm Water Theme Park, Ootty, etc.

24 COMMUNITY OUTREACH PROGRAMME

The students of various classes get a chance to be involved in philanthropic acts through Outreach Programmes organized by them. During their Assembly Week, the students of that particular class are taken for social visits to Charity Homes. The students put up programmes and provide food for the inmates and spend quality time with them. These visits help to inculcate the responsibility towards the society, develop tolerance and humane attitude.

SPORTS

The ANNUAL SPORTS DAY is held every year in November. It is day filled with zest, sporting spirit and healthy competition, full of colour and activity. Various drills, athletic competitions, colourful and innovative races, staff events and Inter- House group competitions such as Tug-O-War, Relay etc. add fun and vigour to the day. Throws and Jumps are conducted earlier.

Every year the following Tournaments are conducted:

CLUBS

A variety of clubs such as Eco club, Art & Craft, Culinary Club, Literary and Dramatics, Health and Wellness, Cyber Safety Club, Yuva Tourism Club, Anti Narcotic Club, Maths Club, Quiz Club, Sports Club etc., have been set up in the school in order to mould the students to be an interactive part of their social environment.

INTERACT CLUB AND MODEL UNITED NATIONS CLUB (MUN)

The Interact Club of Assisi Vidyaniketan Public School takes up various leadership programmes and programmes for a social cause. The Assisi Model United Nations equips the members with the proceedings of the UN general assembly and also helps to hone their leadership and communication skills. The various International programmes on the online platform are also taken up by the Interact club and AMUN to equip our students on the global platform.

ASSISI TOASTMASTER'S GAVEL CLUB

The club provides the Toastmasters experience to our students by following similar Toastmasters club meeting protocols. The Gavel Club uses club officer titles and Toastmasters international education manuals for public speaking and leadership training with an excellent opportunity for community service and personality development.

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YOUTH LEADERSHIP PROGRAMME (YLP)

The Youth Leadership Programme is organized by Assisi Toastmasters Club. The distinguished Toastmasters take various sessions for the students who enroll. The last session is a Grand Finale during which Table Topics and Speech Contests highlight the skills acquired by the students.

BALAJANASAKHYAM

Akhila Kerala Balajana Sakyam Assisi Vidyaniketan Public School Branch is fully functional in the school. This is an initiative of the popular Daily Newspaper, Malayala Manorama. New office bearers are inducted every year giving students opportunities for honing leadership skills. Each year a theme is shared by the District coordinators and the Patron of the Sakyam brings in eminent personalities to give talks and conduct awareness programmes for students. Our students participate in the various literary and cultural programmes organized by the Sakyam.

PRE-VOCATIONAL TRAINING @ ASSISI

Assisi offers Pre-vocational Training to the students of Classes VI-IX & XI in the disciplines of Electrical, Plumbing, Carpentry and Gardening. This was done as part of the Bagless Day activities of the school. The students gained hands-on experience in basic activities related to the aforementioned skills.





FACILITIES

LIBRARY

Our State of the Art Readerz Haven Bibliotheca is an Automated Self Book Issue and Return System. It has a unique Amphitheatre Model seating for junior students. The books are arranged by category and author with unique names and attractive displays to woo the students. It has an eye catching display of the new arrivals. There is a teacher's Corner for the members of the faculty to indulge in reading. GENERAL RULES OF SCHOOL FUNCTIONING

REGULAR ATTENDANCE :

- All students should be regular in attendance. Students should not absent themselves for casual reasons such as, celebrations, extended holidays, etc.
- 75% attendance is compulsory for promotion.
- Those taking sick leave must come with the leave record duly signed by the Parent. If the child has contracted fever or other contagious illnesses, they must compulsorily take the stipulated period of rest and produce Medical Fitness Certificate to re-join school.
- In case the student needs to be taken home early, the Parents must send a letter, stating the reason, the time and with whom he/she should be sent.
- In case of sudden emergencies, the Parents themselves should pick up their wards. No phone calls will be entertained in this regard.

2. PUNCTUALITY :

- Attendance will be taken with the first bell and those who are not present will be marked "Absent". The School gate will be closed at 8:05 a.m. and opened again only after Assembly.
- If students arrive late, the "Late" marking will be recorded and three repeated defaults in this regard will lead to "Warning". For any repetition thereafter the student may be asked to return home.

3. SCHOOL DIARY :

- Parents should ensure that their wards bring the school Diary to school every day.

They should also go through the diary frequently and counter - sign any remarks written by the teachers. Parents are also free to communicate with the teachers using the diary.

4. ACADEMIC GUIDELINES :

- Every student is expected to carry notebooks/ Work sheet files and text books to school only as per instructions given by teachers.
- Carrying heavy bags to school is not recommended
- No Home - tasks are given in Classes I & II and only alternatives to home work are given in Classes III - V.
- Home-work given in Classes VI upward should be done carefully and submitted on schedule.
- Parents must compulsorily monitor the child's progress at least on a weekly basis for Primary classes. Portions covered will be informed from time to time.
- Actual project work (if any) will be done in school and materials for this will be made available in the store as far as possible.

5. ASSESSMENT & EXAMINATION SYSTEMS:

- A new system of Assessments and Exams has been put in place by CBSE. Compulsory Board Exam in Class X, inclusion of full portions for Annual Exam / Board Exam and Internal Assessment for 20 marks are some of the features of this system.
- In Classes IX-XII separate pass marks are required for theory and practical. In Classes IX/XI a student who fails to get pass marks in all subjects (33% in theory and practical separately) in the Final Examination is not eligible for promotion to Classes X/XII.



6. CO-SCHOLASTIC ACTIVITIES:

The following co-curricular subjects are to be taken up as compulsory /optional subjects at various levels:

Vocal & Instrumental Music / Dance
Art & Craft
Computer Science

7. HEALTH & PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Daily time allotment has been made for Health & Physical Education which is very much part of the curriculum. The school provides opportunities for Sports, Games and other activities and every student from Class VI upward must compulsorily take up at least two of these activities.

8. CLUBS:

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Various clubs also function in the school for the benefit of students and participation in these club activities is compulsory for students from Classes VI to X.

9. HOUSE SYSTEM & ACTIVITIES:

To impart a healthy, competitive spirit among the students and to develop in them team spirit and leadership qualities, the school has an efficient system of Houses. To encourage co-curricular and Sports activities, Assisi Talent Fest & Annual Sports Day are conducted every year in which students are expected to take part.

10. SCHOOL LIBRARY:

- The School has well stocked Libraries for reading and reference which cater to the children's needs. The Reading Corner facilitates light reading. A good number of magazines and newspapers are subscribed.

- The School Library functions between 8 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. on all working days. Students are encouraged to make good use of the Library and develop strong reading habits.
- Strict discipline is expected in the library.
- Failure to return books in time or loss of books will result in imposition of fine.

11. PUBLICATIONS

The school magazine displays the multi-farious programmes organized by the school for the academic session. It is an avenue for the students to exhibit their myriad talents in art and literature. The School publishes a monthly e-newsletter titled "Newscast" to showcase all the activities of the school during that month.

12. STUDENT COUNCIL

The Student Council comprises of School Captain, School Vice - Captain, Sports Captain, Sports Vice - Captain, the House Captains and House Vice - Captains of the four Houses.

13. DRESS CODE:

- Students should attend school in the prescribed uniform and should at all times be neatly dressed. Personal hygiene is to be maintained.
- Only black school shoes should be used. No fancy shoes are allowed. Shoes must be clean and neatly polished.
- On Wednesdays, students should wear their House colours.



- During the rainy season students are permitted to wear only black Sandak sandals instead of shoes.

- Boys are expected to wear their shirt properly tucked into the belt and trousers. Low waist and narrow trousers are not permitted.

- Girls should have their long hair neatly plaited. Shoulder length hair should be made into a pony tail and those having bob cut should wear black hair band. Girls must not sport hair bangs; these should be neatly pinned back away from the forehead, using black hair bands / clips.

- Boys should follow crew cut hairstyle. They should have their hair cut regularly. Senior boys are not allowed to sport moustache/beard, they should come to school neatly shaved.

- No jewellery is permitted except small ear studs (multiple ear studs not permitted) for girls. Students are not permitted to grow or polish their nails, colour their hair or hand, or use any kind of cosmetic makeup including eye makeup.

- It is compulsory for girls from Class I-VIII to wear black/blue bloomers/tights (knee length only). All boys must wear inner vests.

- Students are not allowed to enter the school campus without proper uniform and ID Card, even when they come for extra-class/sports coaching, meeting teachers, signing documents, even on days of special functions and rehearsals, unless specified otherwise.

14. DISCIPLINE BEHAVIOUR CODE

- Students are expected to behave with self-respect, dignity and decorum at all times, inside and outside the school campus.

- Students must be cultured and polite in their dealings with each other and should not cause willful or careless injury to their companions. Bullying & Ragging are strictly prohibited and perpetrators of such behaviour will be dealt with sternly.

- Smoking /Use of Alcohol or Drugs inside or in vicinity of the Campus is prohibited and those found indulging in this will be rusticated.

- Students must give due respect to all elders, including all teaching and non-teaching staff and outsiders.

- Any acts of willful indiscipline, continued even after due warning, will be taken seriously and action taken accordingly.

- The students must not misuse school property; engage in graffiti on walls, furniture, etc., spoil or deface library books, sports equipment, laboratory equipment, etc. Fines will be imposed if such compulsive behaviour is noticed.

- All belongings of the students must be neatly labelled with their name, class, etc. Students should take care of their own belongings. The school may not be held responsible for any lost articles.

- Students using School bus facility must be polite and respectful to the bus staff and also maintain discipline in the bus and follow given instructions. Parents must give an undertaking to this effect.

- Being an English Medium School, students are expected to speak in English amongst themselves and with the teachers while in the school campus or while travelling by school bus.

- Students are not permitted to bring or use mobile phones, cameras, pen drives, music systems of any kind, CD's/DVD's or inappropriate books/magazines. If at all such items are necessary for project work, competitions, etc., they should be kept in the custody of the teacher concerned. Such items, if found, without the necessary permissions will be confiscated immediately and will not be returned to the students.
- Students are permitted to bring bicycles to school but at their own risk. They should not ride these inside the school campus.
- Students are not permitted to ride any vehicles (bikes/scooters/cars, etc.) that require license, even if it is not parked inside the campus. Defaulters may be subject to the scrutiny of the authorities concerned and the school will not in any way support such cases.

15. FOR THE SPECIAL ATTENTION OF PARENTS:

- Parents are requested to instill in their wards a sense of respect towards the School Administration and the staff.
- Any complaints may be brought to the notice of the Administration / Grievance - Redressal Cell, either personally or through phone or the suggestion box. However, no anonymous complaints will be entertained.

Kindly make sure that you come to the school and meet the teachers concerned if particularly called for.

- Parents should kindly avoid criticizing the School or the teachers in front of their wards as this may lead to an unhealthy disrespect on their part.

Students found to have learning problems over a long period of time may be referred to the Learning Lab on the advice of the teachers. Those found to be having behavioural problems may be referred to the School Counsellor. Parents are requested to co-operate with the staff concerned in case such a referral is made.

- Parents can meet the Principal on all working days between 8:45 a.m. and 9:30 a.m. in the mornings and between 2:30 p.m. and 3:30 p.m. in the evenings, only with appointment.
- As a rule, parents should not meet the teachers directly, except on Open House Days, but should inform the Principal or Teachers-in charge of the reason. They will then direct the teachers as per the need. Teachers will not be called from the class to meet Parents except in case of emergencies. After school hours, students are not permitted to stay back in the campus, unless they have been specifically called for remedial coaching /sports training by the teachers.
- It is the Parents' duty to see to the security of their wards after school hours, as the staff will be otherwise engaged.
